Each section includes a general description, stories from several members, insights that can help us embrace the Traditions' spiritual principles,

and questions to consider when studying the Traditions either individually or as a group. We plan to have the booklet

available for purchase in July 2017 at the Newark International Convention and from our online store.

S-ATEEN NEWS

S-Ateen is a fellowship of young people, ages 12 to 19, whose lives have been affected by sexaholism in a family member or friend.

As stated in the S-Anon World Service Conference Charter, the term S-Anon is to include S-Ateen. In accordance with Tradition 3, in the absence of local S-Ateen groups, S-Ateen members have been welcome into S-Anon meetings since 1996. Still today, S-Ateen members are encouraged to attend local S-Anon meetings as well as S-Anon breakout sessions at local, regional, national, and international events.

When planning an upcoming S-

Anon event, consider including and proactively inviting S-Ateen members. The S-Ateen Committee can provide S-Ateen breakout topics and help schedule certified S-Ateen Group Sponsors. Certification of local S-Anon members in your host community is recommended, however, to allow for the start of a local face-to-face S-Ateen group following your event. S-Ateen Group Sponsor training is straightforward, relatively simple, and can usually be completed in a timely manner.

At the recent SA/S-Anon Convention in Warsaw, Poland, the S-Ateen Committee

Chair, together with an S-Ateen member, Skyped into a well-attended open breakout on family recovery. This is just one of many ways to introduce S-Ateen to your local community and extend the hand of recovery to younger family members.

All S-Ateen members are also encouraged to join the S-Ateen Online Community which hosts weekly voice meetings, a step study, topics for discussion, a daily devotional, and a calendar of events. For more information, about the S-Ateen fellowship contact the WSO.



Tradition Three

The relatives of sexaholics, when gathered together for mutual aid, may call themselves an S-Anon Family Group, provided that, as a group, they have no other affiliation. The only requirement for membership is that there be a problem of sexaholism in a relative or friend.

Donations from members, groups and events fund a variety of activities that enable the WSO to carry the message and provide mission-critical support to members and groups worldwide.



and BOT members for a portion of their travel expenses to attend the World Service Conference, compensate professionals to help us with financial matters and to maintain our website. The WSO operates on a lean budget with strict spending guidelines. The Finance Committee monitors finan-

cial performance, approving large expenditures according to policy. The WSO and Finance Committee work together to be good stewards of donations, making sure that member contributions are used wisely.

ON TAP FOR DISCUSSION: 2017 WORLD SERVICE CONFERENCE

Members of the World Service Conference (WSC) will be considering a number of questions in Newark this July. Below is an overview of the motions on the agenda.

MOTION 1

Move that the booklet, "Recovering Together: Issues Faced by Couples" be reclassified as Service Literature, and removed from the list of Conference Approved Literature.

The intent to reclassify this booklet is to be up to date with guidelines which states that CAL focuses on how members use the tools of the S-Anon program and Service literature primarily offers suggestions on "how to" conduct certain activities, such as starting a meeting, hosting marathons and international conventions, and handling business matters.

MOTION 2

To approve updates and wording changes to the World Service Conference Charter.

The proposed changes are meant to clarify meaning, eliminate redundant language, and incorporate changes approved by WSC since 2013 when the Charter was last updated.

MOTION 3

To direct the World Service Conference to call for a Fellowship-Wide Group

Conscience to remove all references in S-Anon literature and S-Anon writings specific to the group Sexaholics Anonymous (SA) and replace all references to "sexaholics" (which indicates members of that particular group) to more inclusive language "sexually addicted people."

By separating S-Anon and the language of our literature from SA, we establish boundaries and protect ourselves from becoming involved in "outside issues."

MOTION 4

Move that Couples in Recovery (CR) meetings no longer be a part of S-Anon.

Couples in Recovery (CR) Meetings are a tool used by some S-Anon members to enhance personal recovery in their intimate relationships. They have been recognized within S-Anon, almost since its founding, as "special meetings." They are not now, and never have been "registered groups." The WSO is aware of 12-15 CR meetings in North America, approximately one CR meeting for every 25-30 registered S-Anon groups.

Controversy and disunity have arisen within the Fellowship regarding these meetings, with some members holding that sanctioning and support of these meetings violates S-Anon's Third Tradition.

The S-Anon Board of Trus-

tees (BOT) has made operational decisions based on a perception that CR meetings violate Tradition Three because non-S-Anon members are invited to attend and because (in some cases) attendance is limited to "couples."

The intent of this motion is to ask the WSC to overturn the 20-year-old group conscience on the couples' meeting issue. This fundamental WSC decision will provide the basis for future operational decisions about the status of couples' meetings and their support by the WSO.
